Arnold Palmer Cup - Lahinch 2024

Lahinch Golf Club is set to host the Arnold Palmer Cup in 2024 and Lahinch Coast Hotel is delighted to be part of the exciting golf event for the teams and coaches.

About The Arnold Palmer Cup

The Arnold Palmer Cup was co-founded by Arnold Palmer and the Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA) and began at the Bay Hill Club & Lodge, Orlando, Fla., in 1997. The event is a Ryder Cup-style tournament featuring the top men's and women's university/college golfers matching the United States against a team of International players. The Palmer Cup has been played at some of the world's greatest courses, including The Old Course at St. Andrews, The Royal County Down, Royal Portrush, Baltusrol, The Honors Course, and Cherry Hills. Beginning with the 2018 matches at Evian Resort Golf Club, the Palmer Cup is the only major tournament that features men and women playing side-by-side as partners.

Since its inception, over 245 former Arnold Palmer Cup alumni have gone on to earn cards on the PGA, DP World, or LPGA Tours; 45 have represented Europe or the USA in the Ryder Cup, Presidents Cup, or Solheim Cup and more than 90 have claimed over 415 victories on the PGA, DP World, or LPGA Tours, including 2023 major champions Jon Rahm (Masters Tournament), Lilia Vu (The Chevron Championship & AIG Women's Open), Wyndham Clark (U.S. Open), Allisen Corpuz (U.S. Women's Open), and Brian Harman (The Open), as well as 2023 FedEx Cup champion Viktor Hovland. The United States leads the Palmer Cup series 14-12-1.

The Arnold & Winnie Palmer Foundation supports the Palmer Cup, which provides a platform for perpetuating Arnold Palmer's commitment to youth character development and the growth of amateur/collegiate golf. For more information, please visit ArnoldPalmerCup.com.



Trump International Golf Links Doonbeg (30-minute drive from the hotel)

Cliffs of Moher

The Cliffs of Moher on the west coast of Ireland are one of the most outstanding coastal features of Ireland. The Cliffs are 214m high at the highest point and range for 8 kilometres over the Atlantic Ocean on the western seaboard of County Clare. O'Brien's Tower stands proudly on a headland of the majestic Cliffs. From the Cliffs one can see the Aran Islands, Galway Bay, as well as The Twelve Pins, the Maum Turk Mountains in Connemara and Loop Head to the South. Cliffs of Moher "Coastal Cliff Walk" from Liscannor to Doolin

Targeted at the more experienced walker, the newly constructed 12km coastal path takes walkers from Hags Head outside Liscannor Village along by the iconic Cliffs of Moher and into the village of Doolin. Trailheads with mapboards and designated parking for walkers are located at Moher Sports Field outside Liscannor village, Doolin Community centre outside Doolin village, and at the Cliffs of Moher Visitor Centre.

Walkers are advised that the Cliffs of Moher Coastal Walk is a challenging, remote and exposed Clifftop trail, which requires high levels of fitness and an ability to adapt to changing and extreme weather conditions.

Driving to the Cliffs of Moher is aprox 10-15 minutes' drive (5km) a car park fee & entrance fee is payable.

We offer a wonderful Wild Atlantic Way package which includes an overnight stay and admission to the Cliffs of Moyer Experience.

The Burren Region

A special area / region which is quite unique. A spectacular array of wild flowers, archaeology and landscape. No matter what time of the year you visit there will be natural colour from orchid to blue gentian. Enjoy the walk as you explore the archaeology which hosts ring forts and tombs. For most visitor's main source of attraction is the landscape itself, the unique stone grey contrasting to the nearby seaviews and hills. The Limestone region hosts the most amazing cave systems aswell as being a paradise for birdwatchers. Daily walks take place from Ballyvaughan and we are happy to organise a local guide to make it even more interesting. -

The Burren Perfumery & Floral Centre

The Aillwee Cave

Along the spectacular coastal route taking in the Cliffs of Moher and Doolin are intriguing caves which is an ideal activity for a rainy day. A chance to see the subterranean Burren. See bear pits, stalactites and underground waterfalls. Sample their homemade organic cheeses, honey and fudge in their farm shop.

Bird of Prey Centre at Aillwee Cave

Burren Bird of Prey Centre has been educating and entertaining visitors with dynamic flying displays set against the dramatic Burren Landscape. The mission of the Centre is to aid the conservation of Birds of Prey through visitor awareness and education, whilst actively fund raising for Raptor conservation monitoring efforts within Ireland.

Caherconnell Stone Fort

A new visitor centre at Caherconnell Stone Fort is situated 1km from Poulnabrone Dolmen on the main Corofin-Ballyvaughan road, offers you the opportunity to visit an exceptionally well - preserved example of the stone ring forts, which are to be found in the Burren area. Ring forts such as Caherconnell are thought to have been inhabited from 400-1200A.D.

The Liscannor Stone Story and Rock Shop

Fossils, gems and minerals from Liscannor and around the world. Learn all about Liscannor stone and the ancient quarrying around The Cliffs of Moher. Children love it also – great rocks of different colors and variety to purchase. It was featured on RTE's 2021 Toy Late Late show and children's favorite spots to shop!

Moher Hill Farm

This fantastic Farm experience with stunning views is perfect for younger children, they will adore finding and feeding the animals. Moher Hill Open Farm and Leisure Park is situated overlooking stunning Liscannor Bay and just 9km from us here at Lahinch Coast Hotel.

Doolin

Doolin is a charming small seaside village on the northwest coast of Clare. Set against the rugged Atlantic Ocean and surrounded by the spectacular bare limestone landscape of the Burren, Doolin is a place of breathtaking beauty which is situated 8km north of the famous cliffs of Moher. A traditional fishing village and also renowned world-wide as the traditional music capital. Some seafood on the menu in the Aberdeen Bar & Restaurant comes from Doolin. The ferry to the Aran Islands & Cliffs of Moher Cruise departs from Doolin Pier.

Ballyvaughan

Ballyvaughan – a nice stopping point when touring the Burrren Region is nestled between the hills of the Burren (or mountains, as we call them) and the sea, on the southern shore of Galway Bay.

Families can enjoy the beach at Fanore perhaps allow us to arrange a picnic for you. Hillwalking and cycling are among the most popular pastimes among locals and tourists alike.
